Cost of education

- Number one reason BIPOC students do not pursue a DI
- Often rely on federal financial aid

Unfamiliar with the profession/education process

- Unfamiliar with the process to become an RDN
- Time Management
- Difficulty of coursework
- Language/cultural barriers

Feelings of Isolation

- May be the only BIPOC student or intern in class
- Different schedules, backgrounds, interests, culture make it challenging to connect
- May also have challenges connecting with faculty or preceptors
- May have challenges connecting with classmates

Explain academic pathway

- Provide a clear roadmap for necessary classes, including a roadmap for transfer students
- Have guidance for second career students
- May need to repeat several times, or dedicate a short course to the subject

- Learn about financial aid resources
- If you're a DI- offer a scholarship for diverse candidates

- Provide several opportunities to take mock RDN exams and
- Give constructive feedback on ways to improve score
- Offer suggestions on how to take a standardized test

Student advisement

- Expose students to different career pathways
- Present the profession in a positive light
- Be open to answering questions

Relationships with students

- Get to know your students
- Avoid forming preferences for students who you know better
- Respect that some students are juggling many responsibilities
- Commit to ongoing anti-bias training and actively work against biases
- White students can support their peers as well

Curriculum

- Incorporate diverse, culturally sensitive examples in your teaching
- Allow student so share their lived experiences to the learning environment

Be reasonable about what you can do

- Take into consideration what you can handle- mentally, physically, emotionally, financially
- Are you juggling
 - School
 - Work
 - Family
 - Other responsibilities?
- Even if you go slower, you will still get there!

Find a mentor (or two or three!)

- Someone who understands what you're going through
- Be clear with your mentor what you would like to get from them
- Use them as a sounding board for challenging situations
- More than one mentor may be needed

Background

Lafina will be completing her Dietetic Internship and Masters of Science in Nutrition at Ohio State University. She decided her application. Lafina states that she has been the recipient of a post-grad fellowship grant while waiting for her visa as a single mother. In 2021, with a medical placement procedure at Ohio State and as a child of an American citizen, COVID-19 struck from a co-worker leaving her without work or pay for two weeks. She was granted a travel grant for her visa and, after discussing her situation with her advisor, she was able to secure a grant for her purpose but not being so she knew that she will rise to the occasion!

What the 2021 Advancing Diversity in Dietetics Scholarship means to you?

We want to attain a career as a registered dietitian and be part of the change that will bridge the gap in combating diabetes-related complications, including but not limited to heart disease, hypertension, kidney disease, and Alzheimer's disease.
