1.3 Program resources	1.3	- Content reorganized. - Added requirement for "support of upper-level administration" (1.3.a). - Reworded budgeting process requirement to reflect input by program director into that budgeting process (1.3.c.1). - Added stand-alone requirement for sufficient supervised practice sites (1.3.f). - Removed ISPP-specific documentation language.

Existing directors with a master's degree are permitted to remain in their current position. - Added minimum required FTE allotment for program leadership tied to maximum enrollment (1.5.d.1). - Changed wording from "manage"/"management" to "lead"/"leadership" throughout to emphasize a leadership role.

5.1 Faculty requirements	5.1, 5.2, 5.4	- Separated faculty and preceptors into different required elements (2022 5.1). - Consolidated 2022 5.1 (faculty adequacy), 2022 5.2 (faculty requirements and training), and 2022 5.4 (feedback) into one required element. - Added requirements: - For at least one full-time faculty member, in addition to the program director, must hold the RDN credential (5.1.a.1). - Orientation to include competency-based education (5.1.a.4) - The Nutrition Care Process component of the curriculum must specifically be taught by an RDN (5.1.a.6).
5.2 Preceptor requirements	5.1, 5.3, 5.4	- Separated faculty and preceptors into different required elements (2022 5.1). - Consolidated 2022 5.1 (preceptor adequacy), 2022 5.3 (preceptor requirements and training), and 2022 5.4 (feedback) into one required element. - Added requirement for orientation to include competency-based education (5.2.a.2).

		- Outcomes-data statement now must include program contact information (7.2.c). - Removed specific reference to "computer matching information" (2022 RE 7.3.d). - Cost disclosure expanded into three distinct sub-items: tuition/institutional fees; program-specific costs (course fees, drug testing, lab coats, membership fees); and variable costs (books, transportation, housing) (7.3e). - Added information on the Dietetics Application Process and Traffic Rules (7.2.g). - Prior-learning disclosure is simplified (7.3l).
