Programs Participating in DICAS

April 1: WebAdMIT opens for programs. **August 5:** DICAS opens for applicants.

ALL SUPERVISED PRACTICE PROGRAMS (All DIs, CPs, GPs)*

FALL Due Dates

1. November 1, 2024: Applicant notification due date (last date to notify applicant).

2. November 15, 2024: Applicant decision due date (last date for applicant to accept an offer). SPRING Due Dates

- 1. March 1, 2025: Applicant notification due date (last date to notify applicant).
- 2. March 15, 2025: Applicant decision due date (last date for applicant to accept an offer).

*Note: Does not apply to students selected within the same institution (e.g., Sophomore CP/GP student applying to a CP for their junior year; 3+2 or 4+1 programs; DPD student applying to a DI within the same institution; WIC employees). Also does not apply to ISPP (Individualized Supervised Practice Pathway) PhD students.

February 20th Town Hall: The Q&A portion of the presentation began at 11:39 (39 minutes into the town hall). The following topics/questions were answered live during the town hall:

- Clarification between the fall and spring cycle dates and when programs can use the cycles
- Fall application cycle dates
- Notification and application due dates
- Programs that would not be required to participate in DICAS such as those within the same institution

- Programs can participate in either application timeline or both
- Waitlist procedures within this process
- Sections within the DICAS application that can be updated within an application cycle
- DICAS application fees vs. program application fees
- Traffic Rules and Code of Conduct for applicants and programs

March 1st Town Hall: The Q&A portion of the presentation began at 11:52 (52 minutes into the town hall). The following topics/questions were answered live during the town hall:

- Timing of rollout
- Cost of DICAS
- DICAS logistics
- Flexibility with due dates for programs accepting students within own institution
- Rolling admissions
- Decision process
- Traffic rules
- Shared decision report

Below are the questions that were not answered and the resources that were provided during the live town hall meetings.

• Rollout of Proposed/Pilot Process

• Since this is a pilot program, does that mean the process could end up going back to the matching process if the pilot isn't successful?

ACEND Response: The pilot process was developed to review due dates and timeframe with participating programs before setting the final framework of the application process. Once the pilot is completed, ACEND will collect feedback on the recommended due dates of the pilot and make necessary changes as needed. The revised application process will not go back to the old application/matching process; however, some dates and traffic rules may be updated based on the pilot testing period.

 Can you please clarify - for CPs not currently participating in DICAS - your February email said ALL programs need to participate in the pilot, versus the webinar that says it's optional for programs not currently participating in DICAS.

ACEND Response: For the 2024-2025 cycle, it is optional for programs to use DICAS. However, all supervised practice/experiential learning programs must follow the notification due date and decision due dates. Starting with the 2025-2026 cycle, all programs must use DICAS.

• If a program isn't currently participating in DICAS, are they able to participate in the pilot if they wish or do we need to wait until 2025?

ACEND Response: Yes, ACEND would like to encourage programs to use DICAS during this pilot. You do not have to wait until 2025.

 Clarifying question: If a program is already in DICAS and use D&D for Spring 2024 match, will we be automatically enrolled in Pilot for Spring 2025 Match or is that no longer pilot and is the new process?

ACEND Response: Yes, all programs already in DICAS will continue to use DICAS and then follow the notification and decision due dates starting with the 2024-2025 cycle.

• For a GP that does not use DICAS, does this mean we need to adjust our application deadlines?

ACEND Response: Yes, any supervised practice/experiential learning program must follow the notification and decision due dates regardless of if you are using DICAS for this 2024-2025 cycle.

• Am I understanding this correctly that if our MS/DI program within a University wants to admit students directly from our University DPD program, we don't need to go through DICAS?

ACEND Response: Correct, programs within the same institution who accept applicants straight from their own DPD program into their DI program do not need to use DICAS. This is also true for CP and GP programs that accept students from their own institutions.

• Pre-Select

 I don't quite understand the difference between pre-select and programs being able to set their own application due dates and make offers early that students could accept- could you please clarify?

ACEND Response: Pre-select was developed to allow programs previously approved by ACEND to offer dietetic internship slots to applicants prior to the computer matching process. After the Spring 2024 match, pre-select, as it was developed initially, will no longer exist. Programs in the new application process can set their own application due dates within the required notification and decision due dates for both the Fall and Spring cycles. The due dates provided in the application process are the last dates a program can have their application due or offer acceptance to applicants into their program.

 If the number of pre-select students have increased, why did you remove the preselect option in the new method? Was this decision made from data that all program directors were able to have input on (not just December town hall input)?

ACEND Response: When developing the new application process, the Dietetics Application Process Task Force examined historical data of the matching process as well as the SWOT analysis and feedback from the NDEP applications task force. The increased number of preselected students is an indication of the inadequacy of the match because applicants and programs were accepting applicants outside of the match. The preselect terminology is linked to the match and will no longer exist as it was originally developed. Programs in the new application process can set their own application due dates within the required notification and decision due dates for both the Fall and Spring cycles. No approval from ACEND is needed. Early decision, priority decision, early action, are terms that are commonly used in lieu of "pre-select".

• Can we set our own dates/guidelines for pre-select?

ACEND Response: Pre-select was developed to allow programs previously approved by ACEND to offer dietetic internship slots to applicants prior to the computer matching process. After the Spring 2024 match, pre-select as it was developed initially will no longer exist. ACEND Programs in the new application process can set their own application due dates within the notification and decision due dates for both the Fall and Spring cycles.

 Can we continue to call it "preselect" if we are accepting students from our university into our program?

ACEND Response: Programs can use their own language within their own university of institution as long as the applicant is clear on the expectations of the application and acceptance process.

 If a program was not using pre-select previously and was participating in the match but now would like to admit students from their own institution without going through DICAS, do they have to complete a substantive change report with ACEND to begin accepting students from their own institution? Can we accept our own students from our DPD without having them go through DICAS but then participate in DICAS if we still have slots to fill and hope to get students from other DPDs?

ACEND Response: ACEND is no longer reviewing substantive changes to add pre-select. Programs can develop their own application processes and can accept applicants within their own institution with or without using DICAS. If you then choose to use DICAS to select applicants outside of your own institution, you may do so by following the application process due dates.

• DICAS related questions

• For the shared decision report, can we DPD Directors request that it include 1. the DI director or equivalent with name and email address, to contact for evaluation, 2. the anticipated end date of the student's program, so that we know when to contact that program director?

ACEND Response: The shared decision report is based on the programs using DICAS to accept applications. At this time, we are uncertain if this shared decision report is available to those outside of the DICAS system, i.e. DPD program directors. ACEND has reached out to DICAS about this issue. The task force will examine how DPD directors can obtain information about their students' acceptance into supervised practice programs. The task force will also investigate the details and configuration of the report to identify what sections are already included and what can or cannot be added.

 Would DICAS monitor student applications and if they would participate in both Fall and Spring cycles as well? Can they take multiple offers? Can they back out of a Fall acceptance if accepted to a Spring invitation? ACEND Response: DICAS will not monitor these types of decisions. This information would be located on the program's page within DICAS and/or on the program's website. The program would indicate their due dates for applications based on the cycle. Applicants can apply to as many programs as they choose. An applicant can accept multiple offers prior to November 15 (Fall Cycle) or March 15 (Spring Cycle); however, the applicant must only retain one offer after these deadline dates. The traffic rules set out for applicants will encourage applicants to apply and accept the program of their choice and then notify all other programs that they are declining their offer or withdrawing their application. With 100% enrollment of programs in DICAS, the shared decision report will be a key tool for programs to learn if an applicant holds more than one offer.

In my opinion DICAS is not well set up for programs that match twice a year. All off the "in process" applications and "completed" applications from my Fall 2023 match group (including people who were offered a spot and did not enroll, those who accepted and enrolled, and those who did not finish filling out applications). All of those were still on my dashboard when Spring Match applications started rolling in. So it is muddy - is a person applying again, or is this an old application (there is no sorting in DICAS)

ACEND Response: The Dietetics Application Process Task Force reviewed application systems and learned that the CAS application system is one of the main platforms used by many health professions and other professions and universities. For example, GRADCAS is one of the primary application platforms used for graduate applications and is equipped to meet program admission needs. These features are also available to programs using DICAS. Within WebAdMIT, programs can filter the applications by submission date and would be able to see/sort applications by their due dates, for example, those applying in the Fall versus those applying in the Spring.  If we have a fall match and spring match for two different tracks- how would that be configured? Can both be noted with the different deadlines prior to the March/Dec 15 deadline?

ACEND Response: Within DICAS, programs can configure their application in two ways for this scenario. Programs can have two separate applications within the same cycle with an application due date in the Fall and an application in the spring. The other option is that the program can have one single application within the cycle and once the Fall cycle has finished, the program will update the due date of their application to match the Spring cycle. • Why does DICAS now have fees when they didn't earlier?

ACEND Response: There have always been fees associated with applicants applying to programs within DICAS. DICAS application fee is \$50 for the first designation and \$25 for each additional designation. All CAS applications include a fee, although DICAS is by far one of the lowest fees of all CAS systems.

• If our program does not currently use DICAS, do we need to use DICAS, or can we continue to use our own university application system with the revised dates?

ACEND Response: For the pilot year of 2024-2025 programs are not required to use DICAS; however, starting with the 2025-2026 cycle, all supervised practice/experiential learning program will be required to use DICAS.

• Is there consideration for making the transcript service required so we can ensure the values we are reviewing are accurate? (noticed frequent errors in GPA calculated within DICAS)

ACEND Response: ACEND will not require transcript entry service because this is an added cost to the applicant and further barrier to entry into dietetics. If an applicant uses the transcript entry service within DICAS, they will still need to review and approve their entered coursework.

• How does a program have different requirements in DICAS for students in their institution or agreement and external students?

ACEND Response: The program can have two separate applications under the same program which would include separate requirements for the internal versus external applicant. The program may also include conditional questions in their application that will require different documentation based on how the applicant answers specific questions.  A slide said that DICAS will become the "primary" place for due dates and such. Does this mean the program is not required to also have information on a program webpage outside of DICAS? I guess I am asking if the information required for accreditation is required on both a program website and within DICAS.

ACEND Response: DICAS will become the primary location for applicants to review application due dates and requirements once all supervised practice/experiential learning programs are required to use DICAS. This will allow the applicant to view all available options and filter programs of interested based on a variety of program characteristics. Programs will still be required to include certain information for prospective students on their website according to the ACEND standards.

 Is it assumed that communications between program directors and applicants will occur via the email option on Web Admit?

ACEND Response: While communicating via WebAdMIT is an option for program directors to use, this is not the only method of communicating to applicants that programs can use.

• Application/Timeline questions

• If a program decides to use the fall cycle dates for students to begin in the next fall semester, does the program immediately go into rolling admissions after Dec 15?

ACEND Response: No, after the Fall cycle dates, the program and applicants would start with the Spring application dates. Rolling admissions will only begin after March 16th until the DICAS application closes on July 31st.

• When is "rolling admissions" end for each cycle?

ACEND Response: The Fall cycle does not include rolling admission. Rolling admissions begins after March 16th until the DICAS application closes on July 31st.

• Can you please review the early admission statement you made?

ACEND Response: The notification due date and decision due dates that are to be followed by all programs are the latest dates that programs can notify applicants of acceptance and when programs can require a decision by an applicant. This means that programs can choose dates earlier than these dates, but not later than these dates for both the Fall and Spring cycle. A program can accept students early into the program; but must wait until the Fall (November 15) and Spring (March 15) Cycle due dates to require students to make a decision.

• What about a program rescinding an offer to accept another applicant?

ACEND Response: Programs should not be rescinding offers to applicant to accept another applicant. The program must make offers to applicants up to their program's approved maximum enrollment; the rest of the applicants will be added to the waitlist. If an applicant withdraws or rescinds their application or offer of acceptance, the program may then use a waitlist to make an offer to the next available applicant. This process can continue until the program has filled its slots.

• What about conditional admits who are still completing their prerequisites?

ACEND Response: This will remain as it does now when some applicants may still be completing DPD requirements and waiting to obtain a DPD verification statement for example. The program will need to make their admission criteria and contingencies clear to all applicants. In the unlikely event an applicant no longer meets the program's admission criteria, they can be dismissed from the program.

• What would be recommended for programs who cannot require a deposit (i.e. federal programs)?

ACEND Response: The Task Force is not suggesting that programs require a deposit. This would be up to each program and/or institution. Applicants want the freedom to select the program that is their first choice. Even when a deposit is not required, the applicant will likely still select the program of their choice.

• Is there a standardized way of contacting students regarding decisions (acceptance/waitlist, etc.)? Via email, or via telephone?

ACEND Response: At this time, the task force does not require a standardized way to contact applicants regarding decisions; however, programs can use a variety of methods which include emails through DICAS, emails outside of DICAS and/or phone calls.

 Can a program use the fall cycle for applicants from the same institution for a fall start date and the spring cycle for applicants from outside the institution for a fall start date? In other words, both cycles are used for the fall start but the pool of applicants is different for fall and spring cycles.

ACEND Response: Yes, a program can accept applicants during both cycle dates and within and outside their organization as programs do now.

 If a student accepts a program's offer in the fall cycle, are they able to apply again in the Spring cycle to additional programs or re-apply to programs they may have been rejected from in the fall?

ACEND Response: Most often, programs using the Fall cycle will have a start date before the Spring cycle; however, there is nothing that would prevent an applicant from applying to additional programs in a different cycle as they can now. The process is student-centered and when the focus is on the students and what works best for their circumstances, we anticipate that fewer students will be rescinding accepted offers. Furthermore, within the traffic rules, applicants are informed of their obligation to notify programs that they are not accepting an offer in a timely manner.

• So if you offer to someone on the waitlist, and it is only March 5th, do you give them until March 15th, or since on the wait list, still give a 48 hr turnaround?

ACEND Response: A program cannot require an applicant to make a decision before March 15th even if they are on the waitlist. Programs can ask that they respond within a certain timeframe; however, it cannot be a required decision before March 15th for the spring cycle. After March 16th, the program can set their own turnaround deadlines. The example with the 48 hour turnaround can only take place after March 15.

- Is the 100% DICAS requirement starting in Fall 2025 or Fall 2026?
 ACEND Response: The 100% DICAS requirement will begin Fall 2025 (next year, after the pilot cycle ends).
- If we have an undergraduate DPD and a MS level DI. Our MSDI only accepts graduates of our own DPD, so we are NOT required to follow the dates or use DICAS as we only accept from our own institution?
 ACEND Response: Correct, if you are internally accepting your own DPD graduates into your

ACEND Response: Correct, if you are internally accepting your own DPD graduates into your MSDI, you do not need to follow the due dates and DICAS if you choose not to use them.

- Traffic rules
 - When is the student expected to notify institutions of denying an admission? For example, institutions can offer as early as they would like but if the student can "rescind" up until the 15th dates, what would be an advantage if a student isn't required to decline offers in a set amount of time from accepting the first.

ACEND Response: Within the traffic rules, it states that applicants must decline offers from all other programs that offered you acceptance. Students are expected to notify programs as soon as they make a decision. By the due dates of November 15 (Fall cycle) or March 15 (Spring cycle) if a program did not hear from an applicant, the program should assume the applicant did not accept their offer.

 How does ACEND plan to address potential conflicts or competitive behavior among stakeholders that could undermine the effectiveness of the proposed process, such as penalties?

ACEND Response: ACEND will receive any reports of possible applicant and program misconduct and will handle those situations as they arise; however, ACEND program directors must also follow a Code of Conduct and Traffic Rules which will help ensure all parties are following the process as intended. ACEND is looking at incorporating a requirement into the ACEND policies and/or standards.

 Is there anything that would prevent a student from accepting an offer by Dec 15 but then withdrawing later because they get an offer from a program that's more attractive to them?

ACEND Response: It is up to the applicant to choose a program that best fits their needs. The process is student-centered and when the focus is on the students and what works best for their circumstances, we anticipate that fewer students will be rescinding accepted offers. The Code of Conduct and traffic rules state that an applicant must notify a program if they are rescinding or withdrawing their offer; however, those traffic rules do not specify a timeline.

• Will students be reprimanded or have to pay a fee if they rescind an offer they have previously accepted excluding a medical or emergency need?

ACEND Response: The process is student-centered and programs must consider the students' welfare first. When an offer is extended that is advantageous to the student (e.g., less costly, closer to home, their first choice, etc.), neither ACEND nor its programs should prevent the student from selecting the program that works best for them. ACEND will not require students to pay a fee for rescinding an offer. When the focus is on the students and what works best for their circumstance, we anticipate that fewer students will be rescinding accepted offers.

• Scholarship/Funding

• Our University deadline for scholarship applications is in March. Are we able to share that information with program applicants?

ACEND Response: Yes, programs should be sharing all application deadlines and information about the options for their applicants.

• Is this acceptance binding? What if we don't have scholarships out yet?

ACEND Response: In a student-centered approach the acceptance is not binding, meaning the student always reserves the right to rescind an accepted offer. The program may require the applicant to accept the position no later than Match 15th for the Spring cycle; however, once the scholarship offer is made, the student can reevaluate the offer.

- The questions below are currently being reviewed by the DAP Taskforce. Responses to these questions will be posted soon.
 - For schools bound by the Council of Graduate Schools April 15th resolution, we cannot require students to commit to us until after April 15th if financial support is offered. For many programs, financial support is much of the reason students will choose our programs. How can we participate in this process if the decision date for students is March 15th?
 - Is there a way for graduate schools to continue to offer funding to top applicants AND be in compliance with the "April 15 Resolution." <u>https://cgsnet.org/resources/forcurrent-prospective-graduate-students/april-15-resolution</u>. This resolution prevents requiring an applicant to accept / decline before April 15.
 - Council of Graduate School members cannot force a decision from applicants before April 15. ACEND's proposed deadlines will block all dietetic students from being offered funding. • Training questions:

 At some point, can you please provide a blurb that directors can provide to our University admissions office to help communicate the new admissions protocol? It would be helpful to include dates, the early admit regulations, code of conduct, what specifically needs to be posted on the website, is there a cost to the University for using DICAS, how much is the cost to the student? I would feel more confident if the communications come from someone at ACEND vs me interpreting what I'm getting from the townhall to admissions. We use SLATE as well.

ACEND Response: Thank you for the suggestion. The Task Force will consider developing such a message.

- Other
 - I've been informed that the "Applicant Guide to Supervised Practice" possibly will be discontinued after 2024. This is concerning as DICAS is not easy to navigate and find information about programs. Any comments?

ACEND Response: The Applicant Guide to Supervised Practice is a resource provided by the Nutrition and Dietetic Educators and Preceptors (NDEP) Group. For any NDEP resource questions, contact ndep@eatright.org.

• Will ACEND be requesting programs' information for the Program Directory Page? Add a Program's Open/Closing Application Dates?

ACEND Response: ACEND is not requesting this information from our programs to be reflected on our Program Directory Page as these due dates will change frequently throughout the year. This information will be required within the DICAS application per the program details page.

• Where is the best way to get feedback on the pilot?

• ACEND Response: Feedback may be provided by sending an email to the ACEND mailbox at ACEND@eatright.org.

NDEP Council Task Force

NDEP Council Decision:

- In 2022 ACEND reached out to the NDEP Council to assign a Task Force to conduct a SWOT analysis of the match and make a recommendation to the ACEND Board
- Computer match survey sent to programs and students: Survey results
 - 67% of students are against the match as it stands
 - 70% of faculty are against the match as it stands



ACEND Board Decision May 2023

- ACEND Board voted to establish the <u>Dietetics</u>
 <u>Application Process Task Force</u> to explore potential solutions for the application process
- Make recommendation to the ACEND Board by Fall 2023

Task Force Activities

- Meetings monthly/bi-monthly since June 2023
- Primary focus: student-centered
 - Simplifying/streamlining pathways
 - Limiting costs
 - Minimizing workload, stress and anxiety
 - Fairness to applicants and programs
- Discussed value of match, effective application processes, cycles used by other professions, placing traffic rules, ACEND enforcement, 100% enrollment in a centralized application
- Developed new application process









Feedback on Proposed Process Survey to Program Directors

Survey distributed to program directors to provide input on the <u>first draft</u> of proposed cycle dates.

206 responses: 50% of DIs and GPs; 30% of CPs

Key Takeaways

- No clear concern about cycle dates
- Those who use DICAS are greatly satisfied with the system
- Great concerns that students will accept a program then drop it to accept another one with a later offer:
 - Request to add additional guardrail/due dates
- 85% indicated benefits to 100% enrollment in DICAS
 - Fairness/equity/level playing field were top stated benefits



New Application Process for Dietetics – Pilot 2024-2025 Approved by ACEND Board

- Shifted dates by two weeks
- Removed pre-select
- Added Fall Application cycle dates to mirror Spring Application cycle
- Required all DIs, CPs and GPs to follow the notification date and the decision date
- Did not change: Delayed 100% enrollment in Centralized Application System (DICAS) until Fall 2026 to give programs time to adapt









Reminder: Applicants within the same institution

(Includes all programs within the same institution: university, college, hospital, government agency, business entity)

- Continue using the program's typical process for accepting these students with their own due dates
- Do not need to apply through DICAS



EXAMPLE: Program Using DICAS Setting Up the Admission Process

Example for Fall Cycle 2024

- Configures application in WebAdmit by Jul 15, 2024
 - It takes up to 2-3 weeks to review, approve, and push applications into the live environment before launch
- **Opens application** on Aug 5, 2024 (or after): Applicants can submit application anytime after the program open date
- Sets application due date as Oct 18, 2024: All applicants must submit their applications by this date

- <u>Optional</u>: Programs can offer to waitlisted applicants as soon as an applicant declines a spot

- DICAS opens August 5 for applicants
- James wants to apply to 4 programs
- He searches the program information page on DICAS
 - Programs 1 and 2: Due date of application is December 21
 - Programs 3: Due date is January 5
 - Program 4: Due date is January 15

Example Program Director

- DICAS opens in April for programs
- PD updates their application by July 20 and continues marketing/recruiting
 - PD sets due date for application as January 10
- DICAS opens August 5 for applicants
 - PD begins receiving applications in process
- On January 10, program has 22 complete applications
 - Program accepts 10 students/year
- Program begins the review process (committee review, interviews, etc.)



Application Process Example #3 Program Director

Example Continued

By March 15:

- 7 of the 10 applicants with an offer accept the position.
- PD sends offers to 3 of the waitlisted applicants (Could send an email to all asking if still interested) with 2-day turnaround.
- PD goes down the list until all 3 open positions are filled.

By March 25:

- Program exhausted the waitlist and still has one open position that has not been filled.
- Program opens their DICAS application and continues to market/recruit until the position is filled.











Program Code of Conduct Violations During the Pilot Year 2024-2025

If ACEND receives a complaint about a program not adhering to these rules, ACEND will contact the program to learn more, and if the complaint is valid, subsequent violations may result in additional ACEND action.



Dietetics Application Process Things to Remember...

- 1. This is a pilot
- 2. All DIs, CPs and GPs must follow the notification date and the decision date
- 3. Programs set their own deadline for application due date
- 4. Programs decide when to make an offer
- 5. Program cannot require decision be made by applicants before March 15 (for Spring) December 15 (for Fall)
- 6. Must abide by traffic rules
- 100% enrollment in DICAS is proposed for all supervised practice programs <u>for the 2025-2026 cycle</u>

NDEP Council Task Force

NDEP Council Decision:

- In 2022 ACEND reached out to the NDEP Council to assign a Task Force to conduct a SWOT analysis of the match and make a recommendation to the ACEND Board
- Computer match survey sent to programs and students: Survey results
 - 67% of students are against the match as it stands
 - 70% of faculty are against the match as it stands



ACEND Board Decision May 2023

- ACEND Board voted to establish the <u>Dietetics</u>
 <u>Application Process Task Force</u> to explore potential solutions for the application process
- Make recommendation to the ACEND Board by Fall 2023

Task Force Activities

- Meetings monthly/bi-monthly since June 2023
- Primary focus: student-centered
 - Simplifying/streamlining pathways
 - Limiting costs
 - Minimizing workload, stress and anxiety
 - Fairness to applicants and programs
- Discussed value of match, effective application processes, cycles used by other professions, placing traffic rules, ACEND enforcement, 100% enrollment in a centralized application
- Developed new application process

Feedback on Proposed Process Survey to Program Directors

Survey distributed to program directors to provide input on the <u>first draft</u> of proposed cycle dates.

206 responses: 50% of DIs and GPs; 30% of CPs

Key Takeaways

- No clear concern about cycle dates
- Those who use DICAS are greatly satisfied with the system
- Great concerns that students will accept a program then drop it to accept another one with a later offer:
 - Request to add additional guardrail/due dates
- 85% indicated benefits to 100% enrollment in DICAS
 - Fairness/equity/level playing field were top stated benefits

February 20 Town Hall Themes Confusion about DICAS features

In DICAS Programs can:

- Set their own open and close date for their applications.
- Request documentation based on program needs.
 - Letters of reference, personal statement, unofficial transcripts, etc.
- Configure multiple applications/programs based on differing dates or application requirements as needed.
- Set conditional questions to filter applications for program offerings.
- Filter applications based on submission date, start term, answers to conditional questions or other features set by the program.

FALL Due Dates

- 1. November 1, 2024: Applicant notification due date (last day).
- 2. November 15, 2024: Applicant decision due date (last day).

SPRING Due Dates

- 1. March 1, 2025: Applicant notification due date (last day).
- 2. March 15, 2025: Applicant decision due date (last day).
